Includ-EU¹ is proud to present its final conference in Brussels on the 6th and 7th of October open to regions, cities and organisations across Europe!

Includ-EU is an EU-funded project which worked towards building more inclusive and cohesive European societies by fostering transnational knowledge transfer, experience sharing, cooperation and partnerships between local and regional authorities. The project implemented and assessed 7 pilot projects to promote the integration of third country nationals and people with a migration background, at the regional and local level. Includ-EU also developed an informal network of regions and local authorities with different levels of expertise, thus capitalising on the diversity of territorial approaches, policy and practice on integration.

The Includ-EU final conference will showcase the achievements and findings of the project while also providing opportunities to develop further collaborations for the sustainability of the action. The event will offer a mix of activities aimed for a large audience as well as activities aimed at project partners specifically. This event is primarily designed for in-person attendance and fostering in-person connection of participants to encourage the development of collaborations. However, the event will also allow for online attendance and interaction through a dedicated live stream of the plenaries.

The two-day event will feature plenary sessions, a high-level dialogue and press briefing, as well as workshops to further explore the transferability of the project's results, study visits and informal networking moments.

Multistakeholder collaboration and transnational peer learning to improve policies and practices for an inclusive and cohesive Europe

The conference will start with a plenary session examining the role of transnational knowledge and experience sharing for more inclusive and cohesive European societies. Experts will share how they are using peer learning between stakeholders across Europe, to accelerate change by ensuring better transferability, actionable learning, the creation of collective intelligence and cross-pollinisation between initiatives.

The Roundtable Discussion: Local and regional multi-stakeholder approaches for more effective inclusion processes in Europe" will follow, with key speakers from different levels of governance and sectors discussing about the key role of local and regional authorities to facilitate inclusion, governance and coordination, and the whole-of-society approach.

At the end of the day, a press briefing will then be held for participants, representatives of institutions, policymakers and media where the results of the project, as well as findings on what creates sustainable learning communities around inclusion policies and practices will be handed officially over to the donor, the European Commission. This will also represent a moment to strengthen the institutional commitment of the involved partners to a more inclusive and cohesive Europe.

Local and regional approaches for more effective inclusion processes: lessons learned from the Includ-EU pilots, elements of success, replicability

On the second day, the event will focus on the Includ-EU results and lessons learned, outlining the **contexts and needs** in which the pilot initiatives promoting integration at regional and local levels were implemented in their respective territory. After pitch presentations of each pilot, participants, both online and in-person, are divided, according to their interests, into different groups where they can take a "deep-dive" into the challenges and learnings of some of the pilots and gather inspiration regarding the good practices when it comes to replicating them in their own context.
