The speakers will share best practices examples of youth participation and inclusion from their respective structures and regions. The Koordinationsstelle Teilhabe is specifically in charge to foster participation in political and civil life in the canton, with the aim to include as many groups as possible in active citizenship. The Zürich Youth Parliament ensures active youth participation in politics in the canton. They focus on debates, political education, youth advocacy and capacity-building. The Dachverband Schweizer Jugendparlamente is the umbrella organisation of all youth parliaments in Switzerland. They focus on education to foster active citizenship and political participation among young people. The Youth Regional Network, being an inter-regional network across Europe and the "youth branch" of the AER, connects young people and youth councils, to foster peer-learning and exchanges, and to put forward youth participation and recommendations in local, regional and European politics.

The panel discussion will be followed by an open Q&A with the audience, to hear from the (young) participants' experience and models, and to get inspiration from what is done (or could be done) in other regions and countries across Europe.
